As the Department of Defense (DoD) searches for viable locations for these CPTs, I know that you will find San Antonio, affectionately known as Cyber City U.S.A., meets and exceeds the established criteria for placement of these illustrious teams.

Texas is ranked first for employment in the Information Technology (IT) industry and jobs throughout the IT sector, from software engineers to hardware, installation and maintenance are thriving. San Antonio is also quickly becoming the hub of cyber warfare forces with the presence of the 24th and 25th Air Force, NSA-San Antonio, the University of Texas at San Antonio and the skilled private sector workforce that exists in Central Texas and often looks to recruit directly from the military.

These warriors, generally leaving the Active Component, want to continue to serve and protect our nation and state by serving in the TXANG. The TXANG is a perfect choice for these Soldiers and Airmen who are rolling their experience into high-paying civilian jobs, but still desire to serve.

There are also strong academic ties to cyber security in San Antonio. The University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA) is the first Texas school designated as a NSA/DHS center of academic excellence in Information Assurance Education and Cyber Defense. The TXANG and UTSA are currently developing an executive level course in Information Assurance and Cyber Security because of this distinction and an increased National Guard presence would only further this connection. UTSA has also been leading the way in cyber preparedness, partnering with other

universities to make up a consortium that helps states and communities detect and respond to cyber-attacks.




